Charlie enjoys playing outdoors, animals, and would like to be a craftsman. He draws impeccably. Charlie is very smart, and is protective of his siblings, even though he is not the oldest. Many of our youth are older boys (ages 10 and up) and sometimes have not had positive male influences in their lives.

Studies show that youth who form a positive relationship with a role model are more likely to remain in school, less likely to use drugs or alcohol, and experience better relationships with peers and other adults in their lives.
