MEET THE TANZER FAMILY!

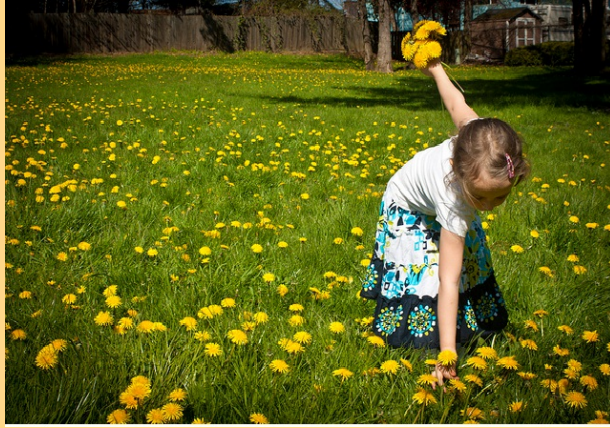
